VANDALISM CONTINUES AT HIGH SCHOOL

For the third time in the past two months the Deerfield High School lawns have been damaged during the late night hours. Tire tracks damaged the lawn area between the softball and baseball fields some time between Monday, June 9th and Tuesday, June 10th. The damage was discovered by the custodial staff early Tuesday morning. The driver(s) also tore up grass in the median strips in the high school parking lot.

A different form of vandalism occurred overnight on June 11th when vandals removed light bulbs from the softball and baseball scoreboards. A similar incident happened last summer when vandals busted the lights in the scoreboards. Superintendent Michelle Jensen noted that "the district is actively pursuing some type of security camera equipment and has received one quote already." Jensen went on to say that the custodial time and repair costs may soon outweigh the costs of security equipment the district will need to purchase as a result of this continued vandalism.
