Forward...Together-Deerfield Community School District Summarized by Tom Bush, President of Deerfield School Board

In 2008, the Board began asking how we could match our district objectives to key performance indicators. While our past Board goals continued to support increased student growth and achievement, we felt a vital piece was missing from our future planning-community input.

In the early 2009, the administrative team and Board began discussing the need for a future planning process that would include representation from all district stakeholders. It was imperative that we undertook a comprehensive visioning process to ensure the future planning of the district aligned with the values and beliefs of the stakeholders.

The *Forward...Together* Conference gave us invaluable feedback. Table-top conversations during the two day workshop brought together past, present and future beliefs about the best ways to educate and prepare our students for the 21st century. The results of the conference gave the board four focus topics for further discussion: character and citizenship education, the teacher evaluation process, district-wide curriculum mapping and building community support.

After several board planning meetings, we established four district objectives which are tied to the focus topics. We are now in a position to better assess our efforts and allocate resources to meet our objectives. Thanks to the efforts of the *Forward...Together* participants, we are pleased to continue our commitment to excellence and equity in educating all of our students.

In the summer of 2009, we held a *Forward...Together* Conference where over 50+ district stakeholders shared their thoughts/ideas on our past, present, and future. This was an exciting learning experience which brought together the ideas of many.

Quality Education in Deerfield Schools

Participants in the *Forward...Together* workshop were asked to identify factors that would help define a “Quality Education in Deerfield Schools”. Six categories, listed below, were established with many ideas contributed under each category. Ideas of a similar focus were joined together. Through a voting process those ideas were narrowed to the top ten priorities and further narrowed to the top four priorities for recommendation to the school board.
