# <u>From the Reading Corner – Family Reading Activity</u>

Choose a storybook the entire family will enjoy. Then, brainstorm 15 instructions with your child. The instructions will be used to determine whose turn it is to read. Examples: Pass to any other reader; sing a song while passing to your left; pass to your right while standing on one leg. Write each instruction on a slip of paper and put the slips in a bowl. Pick someone to read the first page aloud. Then, that person draws a slip and passes the book according to the
