June 11 (registration deadline is May 6)

Due to a successful grant application through the Dane Country Cultural Affairs Commission, the Deerfield High School English department enjoyed the privilege of hosting a professional actor from the American Player's Theater, David Daniels, for the second consecutive year.

Daniels spent the second week of December visiting Deerfield HS English classes throughout the day, leading students in a workshop titled, "The Potency of Poetry." The workshop, which was project-based, began with Daniels challenging students to think more deeply about poetry. "Poetry is not just words on a page," he exclaimed. Daniels encouraged creative expression and feeling, ultimately engaging students with the joy and power of language. After much thought and a good deal of laughter, the workshop concluded with each student choosing a poem and then reading it, *presenting* it aloud to the class.

The experience was fresh, exciting, and at times, frightening for students as it stretched them to push the boundaries of both their perception of and confidence with poetry. For educators, it was fantastic to see students shine. Students met challenges and grew in their appreciation and knowledge of poetry. Like last year, the workshop again proved a wonderful opportunity for students to learn with such a charismatic, enthusiastic, and intelligent professional who in fact makes a living bringing language to life.
