School Immunization Law New Tdap and Varicella Immunization Requirements for Students

Last year the Wisconsin Student Immunization law was changed. Two different vaccine requirements were added which may affect your child's compliance with the law. The vaccine requirements are being be phased-in until all intended grades are covered. The grade requirements advance two grades each year. Parents are required to have their child vaccinated or claim a waiver.

New Requirements for the 2009-2010 School Year

- 1 dose of **tetanus**, **diphtheria and acellular pertussis vaccine** (**Tdap**) for students entering **6th**, **9th and 12th grade** and
- 2 doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine for students entering Kindergarten, 6th and 12th grade.

Please note that all students entering 6th, 7th, 9th, 10th, and 12th are now expected to meet the Tdap requirement and all students entering K, 1st, 6th, 7th, and 12th are now expected to meet the Varicella requirements. Students entering 1st, 7th, and 10th grade were required to be in compliance last year so this information is being directed at the grades indicated in the "bulleted" area above.

Exceptions to the Tdap and varicella vaccine requirements

- Tdap vaccine If your child will be entering 6th, 9th or 12th grade and already received a tetanus-containing vaccine (eg. Td vaccine) within the last 5 years, your child is compliant and the Tdap vaccine is not required.
- Varicella vaccine If your child had chickenpox disease, even after the 1st dose of varicella vaccine, further doses of the vaccine are not required.
